JACKETS AND SWEATSHIRTS

Please make sure your child is bringing a jacket/sweatshirt to school everyday. Because of our unpredictable weather, we highly recommend sending your child dressed in layers. Wear a sweatshirt or long sleeves and bring a light jacket. The mornings tend to be cold, while the afternoons get very warm. We spend lots of time outside regardless of the cold weather so please make sure your child is suitably dressed. We can't stress enough-LABEL ALL JACKETS, COATS AND SWEATSHIRTS!!!!! Even if your child has a hook with their name on it, it's important to label the item. If you're missing any of your child's clothes be sure to check our lost and found box near the front entrance. October was a busy month for the Maples. Our themes for the month were Fall, pumpkins, and Halloween.

Last month we explored pumpkins! We guessed what was inside our pumpkin. We put our pumpkins in the sensory table and shoveled out all the gooshy guts and seeds.
